Justices, Judges, Circuit Court Clerks and Kentucky Court of Justice Personnel:

Supreme Court amends orders related to high-risk employees, emergency release schedule

The Supreme Court has entered two amended administrative orders related to high-risk employees and emergency release.

Work Alternatives for High-Risk Employees

Administrative Order 2020-66, Work Alternatives for High-Risk Employees and Asymptomatic COVID Testing Leave for Kentucky Court of Justice Employees in a Pandemic or Public Health Emergency, amends Administrative Order 2020-58 as follows:

- Changes Special Emergency Directed Leave to Work Alternatives for High-Risk Employees.
- An employee who is 65 years old or older or provides medical documentation establishing he or she is in a high-risk category, as established by the Centers for Disease Control, may request a work alternative.
- Qualifying employees will be offered an in-office work alternative consisting of a separate workspace and modified work duties, or be approved to telecommute.
- An employee will only be authorized to claim SEDL or other authorized leave if the appointing authority determines that an in-office work alternative or telecommuting is unavailable.
- Employees who were previously approved for SEDL or provided an
 alternative work arrangement due to being at a high risk for severe
 illness must submit a new request for a high-risk work alternative for
 consideration by Human Resources and the appointing authority.

Emergency Release Schedule

In addition, <u>Administrative Order 2020-67</u>, Amended Emergency Release Schedule and Pretrial Drug Testing Standards, amends Administrative Order 2020-45 as follows:

- Adds language to clarify that a defendant who is rearrested on a new misdemeanor or felony charge is not eligible under the emergency release schedule.
- Adds several Class D felonies to the exclusion list based on recommendations from judges.
